- consistent practice
- exposure outside class

Consistent, meaningful practice

- earn rewards for streaks
- student activity reports
- assignments



Accessibility and quality

- cost
- availability
- requirements

Wide access

- no cost for the software or content (not even ads)
- smartphone, tablet, computer
- computer lab, language lab
- WiFi, 3G, LAN
- 24/7/365 access
- microphone recommended, not required



Lifelong learning

- motivation
- use after the semester

Motivation

- gamified learning
- compete with friends
- in-game rewards



Quality, individual instruction

- discussion forums
 - software-specific support
 - language questions
 - cultural questions
- go at their own pace
- document translation
- grammar/pronunciation explanations

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Managing student accounts

- Let them manage it themselves
 - depending on their comfortability, best option
- Create accounts and passwords for them
 - more work for teacher up front, but simpler delivery to students
 - easier to hand over access at end of semester
 - no automated way to do this (yet?)



Challenges

- Explaining the Arabic/French/etc. interface to students
 - student helpers
 - consistent design across languages
- Not all site languages are supported
 - The lone Ethiopian (Amharic-speaking) student
- Helping students type in non-Latin alphabets
 - Many online keyboards have ads
 - Windows keyboard layouts are hard to use
 - Google Input Tools is a great alternative
